



SPRING HAS ARRIVED. Growth is in the air. It reminds me of Jesus' parable:

The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches. (Matthew 13:31-32)

When I worked for the ELCA Global Mission unit, I visited places around the globe where the church was growing. Across the globe, more people are coming to faith in our Lord Jesus Christ every year. Yet in this country, fewer people today claim to be Christians, and fewer Christians are faithful in worship or church involvement.

Yet I trust Jesus' promise about the growth of the kingdom of heaven, which I believe includes the church. I don't get discouraged and I won't give up!

Thank you for considering this topic of growth together with me. Last fall, many of you expressed hope that CLC will grow back to a "program-sized" congregation.

On May 19, Bishop Gronberg will spend the morning with us at CLC. In addition to preaching at worship, in between services he will share what he learned about growing a congregation from his experience serving at Trinity Lutheran Church of Fort Worth. Come, learn, and let's prepare to grow!

MUSIC IS IN THE AIR

Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing. Psalm 100:1-2

I am so grateful for all the wonderful musicians who have enriched our worship during Lent and Holy Week! If you haven't been involved in a choir or other musical group, consider doing so and offering your talent for the worship of our Lord.

On the topic of music, our beloved music director, Hando Nahkur, will complete his studies in May and anticipates receiving his doctorate this autumn. In addition to offering him our deepest congratulations on this accomplishment, many of us feared he would say goodbye if he got a full-time position elsewhere that would utilize his new degree and many skills. We want to keep him here as long as possible, so for several months congregational leaders have been talking about how to maximize the possibility for him to stay here. To that end, I am pleased to announce that the council has offered – and Hando has accepted - an increase in his position at CLC from 25 to 30 hours a week, effective in mid-May. (This increase in hours will also allow CLC to legally offer him health insurance to replace his current student insurance that will end then.) I believe this changed position will provide more stability for both Hando and CLC. With this schedule, he will be able to continue giving private lessons and doing concert performances as he has been doing, while continuing to develop the music program at CLC, working with the growing number of participants and the new monthly contemporary services. Whether this changed position lasts a long or short time, I'm pleased to say that for the near future, Hando Nahkur will remain a valuable member of our ministry team.

MONTHLY DEVOTIONAL



(Matt. 5:1-12; Luke 6:20-23)

I have a pastor-friend who tells me that whenever someone greets him with the usual “How are you?” his response is: “I am blessed! Thank you!”

The response sounds “too religious” to me. I would not feel comfortable saying it in reply to the casual greetings that normally happen between persons. But knowing this pastor-friend, I believe that his intent is not to project his religiosity at all; it is an honest response from his heart, and perhaps it is an attempt to “engage” the person a little deeper than the perfunctory verbal exchange that follows “How are you?”

When Jesus went about teaching, preaching, healing the sick, and driving out evil spirits the people flocked to Him and followed Him wherever He went. Jesus knew their needs and one day he sat down and “engaged” them. He preached to them what we call the “Beatitudes”.

“Beatitude” means a state of blessedness; a condition of being in God’s grace or favor. However, in reading the Beatitudes we may fall into what David Lose, author and pastor calls a “trap”; i.e. a misunderstanding that Jesus is setting up the “requirements” needed to receive certain favors from God.

This misunderstanding tends to fit right into and is reinforced by our life experiences. Before we can receive a benefit we know we first have to work for it; we have to earn it.

Thus, for example when we read Matthew 5:5 “Blessed are the meek for they will inherit the earth” we ask ourselves whether we have a meek attitude; whether we have worked enough on our pride so that it does not serve as an obstacle to our being “meek”. And if we think we have failed in that effort we conclude that we do not deserve to be among those who will inherit the earth. And so we look at another Beatitude, check out its “requirement” and see if it is a better fit for us.

But this is not what Jesus was saying. He saw the crowds--- and “saw” not just their obvious needs but the needs of their hearts and He wanted to bless them. He saw their grief, their poverty, their thirst for righteousness, their desire to see God and God’s mercy. Jesus offered them His grace and favor.

In the same way Jesus offers us His grace and favor today – not for us to work for but only to receive with grateful hearts. This is what the Beatitudes is all about.

Dear Father, thank You for the unconditional love, grace and favor You bestow upon us through Christ. Amen.
