



EQUIPPING - This past year, we've spent a lot of time talking about the call process for your next pastor. Did you know that the word "pastor" only occurs once in the Bible? And the job description for pastors and other leaders in the church is just a phrase? At a recent council meeting, we found it in these words from Ephesians 4, underlined below:

1 I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, 3 making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. 4 There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism, 6 one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. 7 But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift... 11 The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ.

Think about all those who equip us for life. My dad gave me a tool belt and taught me how to help him build kitchen cabinets, and he gave me a baseball glove so I could play baseball. My mom taught me how to mow lawn, my grandma taught me to bake bread and my grandpa taught me to fish. My parents brought us to church and gave us Bible story books, which I devoured. My pastor taught me lessons about faith and the church that I remember today. All these people provided the tools that equipped me for life as a Christian and as a responsible member of society.

This past year, we've also spent a lot of time equipping people here at CLC, giving them the tools for the work of ministry. Much of this effort has been behind the scenes and out of the spotlight: establishing committees, revising job descriptions, and reviewing procedures. It's not glamorous but it is vital for people to stay informed and get involved. Hundreds of people at CLC and in the wider community depend on the ministry entrusted to us.

MY PLANS – When you receive this newsletter, I will be on a family vacation, visiting my sister in Kiev, Ukraine, and then touring Biblical and historical sites in Greece. After my vacation ends on July 12 I will return to Dallas to continue serving with you here. My last Sunday at Christ Lutheran will depend on when the call process here is nearing a conclusion. At that point, I will go to my next interim congregation which I can now announce is Living Lord Lutheran Church near St. Louis, Missouri. You will be kept informed of all the steps along the way as you call a new pastor and I transition to a new call. In the meanwhile, let's continue to enjoy each day working towards the future God has in store for you!

JUNE STORMS BRING DAMAGE TO NT-NL CONGREGATIONS

Wednesday evening June 19th storms across NT-NL Synod, ELCA territory took a toll on at least two of our congregations. In Meridian the facility of the recently closed congregation of Faith suffered damage to its steeple (no pictures available). The synod now has ownership of that facility and will discern next steps.

Redeemer, Greenville suffered greater damage as the roof of the fellowship hall was taken by straight line winds (see photos). My associate the Rev. Kris Totzke and I have spoken with Pastor Debra Leone and offered support. She reports gratitude that there was no one in the building at the time as the community VBS program was being held at the Presbyterian Church. A photo of that time is included from my colleague General Presbyter Jan DeVries of the Grace Presbytery (PCUSA). Pastor Leone reports this has already been a good opportunity for ecumenical connections including the Methodist congregation that is stepping up to help with their food ministry. Will post more updates and needs as we know. Please pray for the community in Greenville. We will support them in their work and discernment and next steps. I will be with them on Sunday June 23rd to meet with their leaders and survey the damage.


CLC & CLP CLOSED: The church office will be closed on Thursday, **July 4**. The preschool will be closed on **July 4 & 5**.

MONTHLY DEVOTIONAL

“Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.” Mt. 5:4 by Emmanuel N. Ilagan

Oftentimes we are at a loss for words to say to someone who is grieving the death of a loved one. We are concerned that we may say the wrong thing and just add to their pain.

I was already an adult when my mother died years ago. I was the youngest child in the family and was the only boy. I was very close to my mother.

On the day of the funeral many friends and relatives came to express their sympathy. I have forgotten the words of condolences they said to me; but an older friend said something that I cannot forget. She, too, had lost her mother just a year before.

This friend saw me weeping and she came over and sat beside me for a while. As I continued to bury my face in my hands she asked if things were OK with me. When I shook my head to say “No” she touched my shoulder and said, “No, this is not OK.” That was exactly how I felt at that moment.

No, death is not OK.

In the raising of Lazarus in the Gospel of John the Lord Jesus saw His friend Mary and the Jews weeping. Jesus was “greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved.” (Jn 11:33, NRSV). The New Living Translation renders this verse thus: “A deep anger welled up within him, and he was deeply troubled.” This interpretive translation of the verse is interesting. It suggests that aside from sadness, the situation triggered in the Lord a deep anger as He was confronted again by the consequence of human sin, which is death.

Jesus then wept. The Lord experienced the same unspeakable pain we go through when we lose a loved one. He was indeed a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief (Isa. 53:3). On the Cross we see that Jesus fully understands our pain. More importantly it is on the Cross and at the Empty Tomb that sin and death have been overcome once and for all.

Yes, things have been made OK by our Savior Jesus.

As we go through our griefs and losses we can cling to Jesus’ promise that He is with us. He knows the pain of separation. Perhaps He even weeps with us.

Therefore we who are in Christ have hope. We look forward to the day when Jesus finally wipes away every tear in our eyes and replaces our sadness with joy.

Dear Jesus, thank you for conquering sin and death. When the time of grieving comes to us comfort us and embrace us with your love and grace. Amen.
